

Letter From District 2 Supervisor, Duce Minor.

Happy New Year! I hope everyone enjoyed the holidays. Bouse moves into the new year looking a little nicer... many thanks to our Community Development Department and our Public Works Department for working through and finishing up on the cleanup of another blighted property (this one on Joshua Ave). Our Community Development Department continues to work with property owners to bring their property into compliance. We all appreciate the property owners who have cleaned up and made improvements to their properties. Folks are noticing the improvements in Bouse!

Thank you again to the Bouse Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors for allowing me to be on their December agenda to introduce Ms. Mel Sanderson, Board Member and Spokesperson for American Rare Earths (AKA Western Rare Earths) Mine. Mel gave a comprehensive presentation on the company's La Paz (Bouse) Project and other American Rare Earth projects. She explained that for a variety of reasons, including a struggling national economy limiting investment, and the quality of the rare earth elements found in other areas, the company will be working on other projects for some time and putting the La Paz Project on hold. It sounded like it could be another five to ten years before they might be working on the La Paz Project.

Offroad racing is back! After not seeing any offroad races here last year, we are excited to see them return. January 10-14, 2024, La Paz County will be the site for the celebrated titan of offroad racing, the **Parker 400**! The race will be part of the **2024 Unlimited Off-Road Racing Series**. The series includes: The Parker 400; The Mint 400 – Las Vegas, NV – March 6-10; and

The California 300 – Barstow, CA – October 2-6. With a new promoter, there will be some changes in how things work this year. For more information on how to watch the race or how to volunteer you can visit **unlimitedoffroadracing.com**.

There will also be more offroad racing in February, when Legacy Racing Association brings the **Parker Dam 500** to La Paz County February 21-25, 2024. Where Have All the Volunteers Gone?

When we moved here in 2005 the town was full of volunteers that pitched in to help set up events, run the events, clean up the events to provide activities, entertainment, and food venues for the community at large. Some were free, some were fund raising, some simple, some complex. Booster Hall had a 'set up crew', rotating cooks, coffer servers, another crew to clean up and reset for the next event. Different volunteers who had signed up for that job once a week or once a month. Or in the case of the Chamber those who volunteered to work at one or all of the 3 or 4 one-time events they hosted each season. The Friends of the Library raised funding by providing comedy shows and had scores of volunteers to perform in them and run their used book store.

Over the course of the almost 20 years the events have continued and in some cases events have been added, and, in the case of the Chamber, tripled with the twice a month Swap Meet, and the 3 times a season Camp Bouse Breakfast Tour, and the Christmas Parade and Block Party hosted by all three of the organizations.

We've had a good run with volunteers through the years to keep our little town lively with events and activities open to residents, newcomers, and visitors. But volunteers are harder to find these days. And our core of volunteers can't last forever. We need new blood...new residents and season visitors alike to step up and take a turn, working with us now, so that Bouse will continue to be the place we all love to be. Think about it! It's happening.

A Glimpse of Bouse's Past Today's Bouse Museum...Yesterday's Assay Office

Editor's Note: This is one of the first articles I had published in the newsletter before editor Pat Schlecht moved away. In 2020 the addition was added through funds provided by local donations and a grant from IDA, and a good deal of sweat equity of local volunteers, to double the size to house our Camp Bouse and other displays, including "Sands of Time, a short movie of the WWII training activities in the surrounding areas

Built in 1902, Bouse's old Assay Office provided the services of Assayer, P. P. Thompson, for the mines at Swansea and others up and down the Bill Williams River. Thompson, a U.S. Mineral Surveyor, lived in and operated the Assay Office until 1923 when the area mining played out. Besides his work for the mines, Thompson surveyed the Original Bouse Townsite in 1910, followed by the Worley Addition to the Townsite in 1916. Mr. Thompson's original Assay Cabinet—specially built by him to house his assay instruments—stakes its claim in the Museum today, thanks to long time residents of Bouse, Wayne and Judy Beulke.

The Beulkes purchased the old cabinet from Clifford and Eda Martin in 1972, not learning its history until after the deal was done. Wayne was especially pleased with his prize since he'd had the pleasure of meeting Mr. Thompson in 1970 after travelling to Prescott with the Martins to visit him in the Pioneer Nursing Home. "Mr. Thompson was very proud of his work and enjoyed the time he spent in Bouse," said Beulke. "He expressed hope to someday return to Bouse."

We don't know much about the assay office building between the mid 20s and early 60s, but have learned that hospitality did reign in Bouse during those days. In the late 60s, a down-on-her luck lady landed in town and used the dirt-floored building as her home until around 1972. Neighbors and local business people were kind to assist her with necessities while the old office served as her temporary home. A photo from those days displaying her laundry hanging between the posts on the front porch can be seen in the book, *Arizona's Best Ghost Towns*, in the rack at the Museum.

One of only two original buildings that remain intact and in use today, the Assay Office was identified and purchased by the Bouse Chamber of Commerce with donated funds. In 1991, a Heritage Preservation Grant was applied for and approved by the State Parks Board for the restoration of the historic building. Completed by resident volunteers in 1993, it now serves double-duty as C of C Offices and the Bouse Museum and Visitor Center. Progress photos and notes of the project are displayed in the Museum.

Today's Museum also features artifacts from nearby mining activities, pioneer homes, early school days, and WWII military operations at Camp Bouse and other training camps in the area. The adjacent Miner's Cabin was moved from the Swansea Mine and complemented with meager furnishings and cooking utensils from the mining days. When you stop by, don't miss the hand-cranked slicer attached to the table in the cabin. Many of us grew up with a hand-cranked grinder...but how many remember the slicer? Ingenious! One childhood memory of our old grinder...Mom always screwed the heavy grinder to the breadboard, pulled out from the kitchen cupboard. As we kids pushed and pulled the crank, auguring chunks of leftover roast beef through the channel, the breadboard made its slow journey in toward the counter and sooner or later—whack—went our knuckles! That was one job we soon learned not to fight for. Sound familiar?

If you haven't taken a trip down memory lane or had your dose of history lately, stop by the Bouse Museum. Take a look around. Talk to Jack and Betty or Terry and Judy. They'll do their best to show you around, answer your questions, and provide you with a memorable experience.
