Letter From District 2 Supervisor, Duce Minor.

FINALLY!... our temperatures are breaking. It's the best time of the year. We see it in our churches, we see it in our clubs, and we see it in the stores... our winter residents are returning. We also see it in our calendars... summer is over, and THINGS ARE HAPPENINNG!

Of course, our county government is hard at work all year long. Here are some of the things happening in the Bouse area.

After dealing with some delays and supply-line issues, Arizona & California Railroad expects the remaining supplies to be on site in the next two weeks and plans to have the Main Street rail crossing rebuilt by the end of November or early December. Our Public Works Department will be working with the railroad to make sure traffic can continue to move during the project.

Last year the County had to condemn the old Book Nook next to the County Library due to safety concerns. We have secured grant funding to build a brand-new structure. The old structure has been removed and we are looking forward to the contractor breaking ground soon, with completion by the end of the year (fingers crossed).

Our Public Works Department is working on an Ordinance for the Board of Supervisors to adopt to allow us to place signs on both ends of Bouse on Highway 72 indicating **NO ENGINE BREAKS.**

We are winding down the grant funded planning process for Bouse Community Park. Once the plan is complete, we will be applying to Arizona State Parks and Trails for funding to complete the project. In the meantime, THANK YOU to the Bouse Chamber of Commerce, our Parks Department, and other volunteers for "shining-up" the park in time for the AZ KIDS BOUSE OFFROAD JAMBOREE!

I want to thank the property owners who have been making progress on cleaning up their property. When our Community Development staff receive a complaint regarding code violations, they open a file on the property. The property owner is contacted (when possible) and then they go through the process of bringing the property into compliance. It often takes longer than most of us like, but it is critical that we do not ignore individuals' rights. In the worst cases, the County can step in to abate the problem. This has been done a couple of times in the past couple of years and we are preparing to abate another property very soon. It is always a better situation when property owners respond to the problem themselves.

I know there has been a lot of concern regarding Heliogen, a proposed hydrogen production facility near Brenda. The company does have a lease with BLM, and BLM allowed the company to drill three test wells to help determine the viability of the proposed project. However, based on recent comments about the status of the Ranegras Plain aquafer by staff from Arizona Department of Water Resources, it does not look favorable, and Heliogen recently withdrawn their application for a major amendment to the County's Comprehensive Plan.

Concerned Residents Meet With La Paz Lawmen

It was standing room only at the meeting with Sheriff Ponce and his deputies and other law enforcement officers and officials on October 10 to discuss the increased number of "break-ins" nd "move ins" in our area. Burglaries have caused losses and damages to private properties, and vandalism to county and business properties. Unknown people have just moved in on properties owned by snowbirds or out of staters, causing gross damage to the premises before the activity is discovered and/or reported to authorities. What the hell is going on? What can we do? Everybody there wanted to know.

The most important thing that resulted...agreed by everyone... is the need to increase awareness in our own neighborhoods and community at large. Get acquainted with your neighbors, make mental note of their vehicles and pay attention when an unfamiliar one is in your area. Train your antenna to perk up when a car goes by that you don't recognize. Be sure to wave if it's a neighbor; but be sure to make a note to be able to describe it...best yet-take a photo... if it looks suspicious. Include the date you saw it. Talk to your neighbors. Maybe they can identify the vehicle before we cry wolf to the cops. If you hear of a burglary or home invasion in the area, spread the word so we can all be on special lookout to better result in apprehension of the perpetrators. As residents and homeowners, it is our responsibility to protect not just our interests, but those of others, to get these people that are committing the crimes in jail.

The meeting ended with promises made:

- Our community will increase focus on our Neighborhood Watch vigil to report suspicious looking vehicles, people, or circumstances to the authorities so they have something to work on before it results in a crime. Remember, it takes evidence to convict perps of a crime. Description, vehicle license, photos, whatever you get to pass on to others in the area and to our law enforcement.
- Communications and photos from the Sheriff's office will be shared to enable our residents to issue their own "BOLOs" on known felons spotted or suspected to be in the area.
- Newspapers will be asked to resume printing arrest records regularly in the local papers.
- Improve frequency and/or routing of patrols around Bouse and outer areas.
- If you see strange vehicles or activity at a property that you know is not the owner, it should be reported to the owners and/or the police. Know how to contact your neighbors is a good rule of thumb.

Let's make it happen by working with each other to improve safety and reduce illegal activities in Bouse and La Paz County.



The people that I encounter may think I do not have bad days But I do. Just because my day is bad does not give me the right to ruin yours.


